# Week of Prayer

For our Week of Prayer, the Lord's Prayer from Matthew 6:9–13 will be our guide as we orient our prayers around it. This prayer comes at the center of the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5–7:29) and at the heart of this prayer is God's desire to unite God's kingdom with life on earth. In Matthew 6, Jesus teaches his followers that prayer is a personal conversation, verbalizing your real needs to a God who is truly present. Each day, we will focus on a phrase from the Lord's prayer and invite you as the church to join in prayer for God's ways to be present in our community as they are in heaven.

## Background on the Lord's Prayer

As you read the Lord's Prayer daily, it is helpful to know that it can be divided into:

**Three requests about God (v. 9–10)**

**Three requests about us (v. 11–13)**

All six of these requests are oriented around a phrase at the very center of the prayer:

**“On earth as it is in heaven” (v. 10)**

This phrase orients each request with:

- 1. A declaration for heaven to come to earth**
- 2. For God's ways and provision to fill humanity**

By orienting ourselves first toward God and heaven (v. 9–10), prayers about us (v. 11–13) are deepened with better understanding and become acts of humility, resulting in heavenly wholeness and peace!

## Why We Pray the Lord's Prayer

We pray this prayer with Jesus, as he taught us to pray, because what you pray shapes what you believe and shapes how you live.

Throughout this week, as we recite this prayer, we are reminded what we believe and what following Jesus is all about. This begins to shape our daily actions as we align our lives with the way of Jesus.

## Daily Morning Reading

Jesus says to us:

### THE LORD'S PRAYER (NET)

We encourage you to read the whole prayer each day, as we focus on one phrase per day, all under the consideration, on earth as it is in heaven.

## Daily Evening Reflection

One big idea of this practice of reflection each evening is to recognize the incredible truth that God is always working in the world, and God is at work in us individually. We simply need to take time to stop and pay attention.

**Ask yourself:** When today or this past week did I sense the deepest connection with God, others, and myself?

- Press into that moment. Bring that moment, thought, or word to the Lord now, and ask him to speak to you about it.
- Why does this moment stand out?
- What might God want to say to you through it?

**Ask yourself:** When did you feel an absence of God's presence? Maybe there is a distinct moment where you felt anger, fear, or temptation.

- Press into that moment. Bring that moment, thought, or word to the Lord now, and ask him to speak to you about it.
- Why does this moment stand out?
- What might God want to say to you through it?

We will be using this practice of Examen each evening at home to open us to both the difficult and beautiful in our lives. This is a useful way of reflecting on what God is saying to us this week by discerning the voice and activity of God in the flow of our daily lives.

If the core theme of this prayer is on earth as it is in heaven, then this phrase recognizes the honor the Father has in heaven and beckons the earth and its inhabitants to the same place of awe.

We see glimpses of this kingdom in the Gospels when Jesus walked among us, healing many and forgiving their sins. We live in the already and the not yet; we are citizens of this promised kingdom, and we know our King is on the throne. Yet we long for the day when heaven comes to earth and God’s kingdom is fully realized.

## Consider

We move from our great physical need to our even greater spiritual need. We echo the prayer of David, “Search me, God, and know my heart.” In doing so, we reflect deeply on the severity of our sin and our incredible need for forgiveness. Just as God provides for our physical needs, he has made provision for our deepest spiritual needs. Heaven has invaded earth and made the way for our debt to be forgiven. This prayer invites us to reflect on those we have been called to forgive. It beckons us to reflect on the great debt we have been forgiven that we may freely forgive those who have wronged us, even as our Father has forgiven us.

## Consider

In this final petition of praying heaven over earth, we seek deliverance from the reality of sin and the evil one, in whom it finds its origin. On the cross, Christ conquered death and sin, setting into motion a day when we would be fully free from the presence, power, and penalty of sin. Until that day, we wage war against principalities, powers, and the forces of evil. As we live in the already and the not yet, we long for the day when temptation to sin will no longer be a reality. Scripture tells us that God cannot be tempted by sin, nor does he tempt anyone. With this prayer, we ask the Father to lead us in paths of righteousness, to go before us and protect us from the evil one who seeks to devour us, and in so doing, we echo the song of David, “The Lord is my Shepherd ...”

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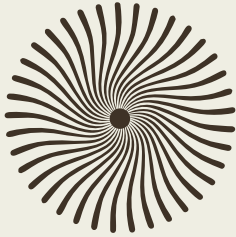
